- Help students to understand routes to careers that they are interested in and to make informed choices about their next step in education or training
- Help students prepare for the workplace, by building self-development and career management skills

Collaborating with our dedicated Careers lead, Head of Sixth Form and Head of Secondary, the Careers Programme is devoted to providing ongoing careers advice and education to students in the Secondary School.

Careers Policy Guidelines

This policy covers the Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) given to all students and is *based* on the Department for Education's (DfE's) statutory Careers guidance and access for education and training providers <u>Careers guidance</u> and access for education and training providers - GOV.UK

Careers guidance will:

- Present clear and impartial guidance.
- Ensure that all students in Years 1-13 have access to independent, accurate, and impartial careers information, advice, and guidance.
- Offer information on the full range of post-16 education and training options.
- Promote the best interests of all pupils enrolled at Baleares International College, Sa Porrassa.

In May 2025, the DfE updated its careers guidance in line with the Government's careers strategy to ensure that all young people in secondary school receive a stable, structured programme of advice and guidance delivered by individuals with the appropriate skills and experience.

Key Components of the Policy

1. Career Guidance Services

- i. Access to career advisors will be provided to assist students in navigating their career planning.
- ii. Workshops with professional external careers mentors and specialists.
- iii. Opportunities for students to engage in career-related workshops and talks with professionals from diverse industries to enhance their understanding of various career paths.
- iv. Topics such as resume writing, interview preparation, and job search strategies will be covered in detail to ensure students are well-equipped for the job market.

v. Assistance provided to find work experience in a variety of industries.

2. Career Education Programme

- i. Careers Education will be designed to meet students' specific needs, fostering early engagement with career planning.
- ii. Students will have access to up-to-date and relevant career information through our online platforms and school resources. Research and preparation will focus on essential skills like writing application letters and CVs.

3. Work Experience

- All students are encouraged to participate in work experience placements in fields of interest, with support provided to help them secure appropriate opportunities.
- ii. The program will facilitate communication between students and employers to ensure a smooth experience for all involved.

4. Partnerships

 We will actively seek to establish partnerships with parents, local businesses, and community organisations to enhance career education experience for our student
